- <u>DOWNLOADING:</u>
 <u>IMPORTANT: YOU SHOULD DOWNLOAD the packet and OPEN and WORK from the</u> <u>DOWNLOADED version. Save it to your desktop</u>. This will save time and allow you to reference the file later. You must have high speed Internet access.
- 2. PRINTING:

Use the PRINT icon on the document. (It will look like a small typewriter.) YOU CAN PRINT AN INDIVIDUAL PAGE by selecting RANGE (i.e. 2 of 2 to print page 2) or CURRENT PAGE, or you can use the Print icon located at the top of the PDF document. Do NOT go to FILE and use the Print Option on your Browser because each page would then have to re-spool, and it will take too long to print.

- 3. PRINT THE TABLE OF CONTENTS FIRST (Page 3-4). For your convenience, each page in the Registration Packet is numbered. It would be helpful to have the Table of Contents to look at while you are selecting the flyer/forms you need.
- 4. The fields that require you to enter information (i.e., Name, Address, Telephone) are interactive which means you can type directly on the form and then print it out. If you use the data entry forms on pages 11-12, duplicate data throughout the packet will only need to be entered once. Please note: Be sure to fill in the other areas that are NOT automatically filled in.

* Click the mouse on the field and begin typing - use the TAB key to move from one field to the next

* PRINT the form you have typed on before moving on to the next form or print forms before closing the registration packet. Data information that was typed can be saved if you have version XI or above of Adobe Reader. It allows you to save the packet after entries have been made. Earlier versions of Adobe Reader do not allow saving of data.

- Students should arrive during their scheduled time.
- Students should NOT drive their own car and should be driven by a parent or guardian.
- Students should sit on the passenger side of the car to allow for a simple and safe exit to check in, drop off any forms, and proceed to take their ID picture.
- One car siblings may arrive together at any of the sibling's scheduled times.

- At designated point, student will get out of the car and enter the South Gym door.

- A photographer will be present to take pictures. You will be instructed as to which camera to go to.
- After the student's ID picture is taken and pickup card, they will exit the North Gym door and return to their vehicle.

- If you purchased a yearbook, your student will let the volunteer know when they arrive, before they enter the gym. If a yearbook is purchased, a volunteer will approach the car, confirm the yearbook was purchased, and give it to the driver or person waiting in the car. You do not need to exit the car to pick up the yearbook.
- If you need to borrow a Chromebook, proceed to the SMERT gate.
- Exit at Driveway #5 located near the Fieldhouse.





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As students at one of the top high schools in the nation, Peninsula Panthers exemplify the highest levels of respect, honor, and pride in the classrooms, in the athletic arenas, and in all aspects that define a Peninsula Panther.

Honor Code:

A Peninsula High School education is not solely about GPAs and college applications. It includes the responsibility to perform with honesty and integrity, essential attributes that remain as critical character traits long after graduation. Adhering to these ideals fosters an environment centered around trust and respect, and serves to further distinguish Peninsula students and this institution.

The Honor Code encourages students to act with maximum respect for themselves and others. A Panther demonstrating honorable behavior, among other things, will:

- Strive to perform to the best of his/her ability
- Do the right thing in accord with the highest principles (even when no one is watching)
- Meet all deadlines and come to class prepared
- Present honest and accurate reflections of his or herself (including what is said or done, or put in ink or cyberspace)
- Follow proper channels if he/she has a concern
- Be graceful in defeat whether it be losing an athletic contest, receiving a disappointing grade, or not being selected for a coveted position
- Accept responsibility for his/her actions and their respective consequences as valuable life lessons

Panther Pride will inspire students to be honor-bound and to refrain from questionable behavior of any kind including, but not limited to, the following:

- Bullying or harassment (including cyber bullying)
- Cheating, forgery or plagiarism
- Tardiness or truancy
- Period absences on days when tests are being given or projects are due (unless prearranged with teacher)
- Vacations scheduled on school days

Students should remember that they belong to a caring school community so that if issues arise they should seek help, ideally before an honor code violation occurs. Teachers also understand that no one is perfect. While breaking the honor code may result in disciplinary action, it is more important to the faculty that students learn from their mistakes and grow.

Cheating in schools across America continues to be rampant and Palos Verdes Peninsula High School is no exception. According to a 2008 survey of more than 29,000 students at 100 randomly selected high schools nationwide revealed that 64% admitted to cheating at least once during the past year. Furthermore, 38% reported that they cheated two or more times in the past twelve months, up from 60% and 35%, respectively, in 2006. Most colleges and universities report that for students caught cheating the consequence is immediate dismissal.

Palos Verdes Peninsula High School is dedicated to promoting a learning environment based on a foundation of personal and academic integrity. Our goal is for students to build an independent foundation of critical thinking skills so that such actions are not necessary to achieve success. To accomplish this goal, we need your support and active involvement in reinforcing the importance of academic integrity.

Palos Verdes Peninsula High School National Honor Society



National Honor Society (NHS) is the nation's <u>premier</u> organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. More than just an honor roll, NHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, & Character. These characteristics have been associated with membership in NHS since its inception in 1921.

Today, it is estimated that more than one million students participate in activities of the NHS. NHS chapters are found in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, many U.S. Territories, and Canada. Chapter membership recognizes students for their accomplishments and challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service.

The PVPHS chapter of NHS will have candidate information packets available at the MANDATORY Honor Society Information meeting Wednesday, September 2nd. Candidate information packets (CIP's) are a means to record service hours and leadership. PLEASE check the eligibility list (posted on Mrs. Borstel's school NHS page/classroom door) to see if you (student) meet the requirements (such as minimum 3.65 unweighted GPA with no U's in citizenship). Students may submit CIP's for selection in either their junior or senior year. The process by which students are selected is based upon adherence to the four pillars of NHS: Scholarship, Leadership, Service and Character.

California Scholarship Federation (CSF)

California Scholarship Federation (CSF) is an organization that emphasizes high standards of scholarship and community service for California high school students. It was founded in early 1921 and is the oldest scholarship and honor society organization in the state of California. Please read the following information about the organization and find out why you should join as well as finding out important dates for the new school year!

PVPHS Chapter of CSF

California Scholarship Federation (CSF) honors outstanding high school students for their academic excellence and community service and is recognized by colleges and universities throughout the country as well as overseas. Students may join CSF by simply applying for membership after each semester's grading period (eight semesters total by graduation). Students may apply for membership should they meet the eligibility requirements (see below for specifics). Students may check the eligibility lists that are posted outside of H65 and the Hawthorne Office to see if they meet the requirements. Should a student be eligible for membership, they must apply during the collection period. Please note that students are not automatically inducted into CSF; they must apply for membership each semester. If a student is a member in CSF for at least four (4) semesters by graduation (only sophomore through junior years with at least one semester from their senior year), they are granted the title of CSF Sealbearer. They are presented gold cords to be worn at graduation, gold seal on their diploma and a note on their official transcript that indicates they have achieved Gold Sealbearer distinction. They are also eligible for one of the many scholarships that CSF awards every year.

Freshmen may join CSF after they have completed one semester of high school. They are considered junior or associate members under the constitution of the state CSF Board. Therefore, their first year in high school does not contribute to Sealbearer status; once again, only their sophomore, junior and senior years count. However, students are encouraged to join and be recognized for their academic achievement. CSF membership is published each semester in the principal's update and on the CSF web site.

During the spring semester of their junior year, members in good standing are eligible to run for a position on the CSF Board which they will hold as a senior. The positions of president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, and four at large representatives are open. Board members assist with the membership drives, the Gold Sealbearer Banquet, as well as the yearly elections. This provides an opportunity for leadership experience and school involvement.

The Application/Membership Process

The application process is rather simple as it consists of three lists that weigh academic required classes, academic electives, as well as other qualifying classes and activities (such as AVID and Orchestra). Ten points must be earned (on each semester's application) to be eligible; applicants are disqualified if they earn a D, F or U in any class that semester. The points are based on the grades a student receives; three (3) points for each A, one (1) point for each B. If a student takes an honors or Advanced Placement (AP) class, they will earn a bonus point for the grade (i.e. A in AP Chem-

istry would be four (4) points, three (3) points plus the bonus point); however, you may only use two honors or Advanced Placements classes for the bonus point(s). The cost for membership in this non-complusory organization is \$25 each semester. Community college credits taken concurrently with the high school courses may be used on the application. See https://pvphs.pvpusd.net/apps/ pages/CSF-NHS for sample application. Please note: participation in school and community activities is encouraged, but is not required for general membership; however, if a student earns Sealbearer status (membership in four semesters starting with their sophomore grades with one during their senior year), they may apply for the community service stole which is worn at graduation. The stole signifies that a student has not only achieved high marks in high school and has also devoted much of their free time to assisting their community. They simply have to show proof of a minimum of 50 hours community service.

One important thing to note, applications must be submitted by the designated deadline, retroactive membership is NOT allowed except for grade changes by faculty. Another thing to note about the application process is that the deadline is very specific and set in stone. If the deadline is 12:45 p.m. by September 23rd, the application will not be accepted if it is turned in at 12:46 p.m. on September 23rd. The applications must be turned in by the applicant; no one else may turn it in for them regardless of the situation. The application period is roughly two (2) weeks long; plenty of time for students to handle their business.

Transfer Students: If a student transfers from another school in California and was a CSF member, they must notify adviser as the membership is transferable. If a student transferred from another school in California and was not a CSF member, they may not go back and apply for membership for semesters past; however, they may start the process at Peninsula if there are still four semesters in which they will attend the school. Transfer students, PLEASE notify adviser immediately and she will help with the process. Out of state transfer students, please see adviser as the process is a little bit different for you.

Fall Membership Collections - August 31st - September 11th

Please note: due to the unusual circumstances we have faced this year, fall membership will be based on 3rd quarter grades from spring as well as grades received in June 2020 Please email adviser with questions regarding eleigiblity. This collection period is NOT for incoming freshmen as they do not have any grades in high school as of yet.

Spring Membership Collections (based on grades received in February 2021): February 3rd – 12th (tentative dates)

Please note that summer school grades may NOT be used under any circumstance. Check with the adviser before submitting the application if you have questions. For students' convenience, there will be an eligibility list posted outside of the Hawthorne Office as well as H65 which contains the names of all students eligible for CSF. The completed applications will be submitted differently this year due to current circumstances. Please look for information in the daily bulletin about the specifics regarding the application period. Palos Verdes Peninsula High School Attendance & Off Campus Policies

2020-2021

(May be modified due to the Covid-19 Pandemic situation. TBD)

Absences

The absence of a student from school, whether excused or unexcused, has a twofold effect upon the educational process. The absence not only removes the student from the classroom setting, but also impacts the District's ability to provide quality instruction. It is recognized that most absences are unavoidable and that most students make-up the work they missed.

Per current legislation, schools are funded for students in attendance each day (ADA). Although, the PVPUSD has one of the highest attendance rates in California, the financial impact of student absences continues to strain the District's financial resources. The School District receives a payment of \$50 from the state each day that a student is in school. Families are encouraged to plan medical appointments, activities and trips during the holidays or vacations to ensure the best possible learning experience.

Schools receive funding only for days in which a student is in attendance for at least one class period. If students must make appointments during the school day, it is important that they still attend school either before or after the appointment so that ADA monies will not be lost. However, if it is absolutely necessary for students to miss school, parents may assist in the recovery of funds by having the student complete the Independent Study Contract (if the student will be absent from school for 5 or more days) or by making a donation of \$50 for each day that the student is absent.

Working together allows schools to provide the strongest possible educational opportunities for our students.

Tardies

It is very important for students to arrive to class before the bell rings. For habitual tardiness, the student will be referred to the Student Attendance Review Board (SARB). Habitual tardiness becomes an attendance problem subject to disciplinary action. A student will be marked tardy if he/she arrives to class up to 30 minutes after the bell rings without appropriate permission from the office. If a student arrives to class over 30 minutes late, they will be marked as "excessively tardy." 3 excessive tardies = truant.

Arriving late up to ten minutes after the bell rings without appropriate permission from office or teacher. Tardy offenses are recorded per course.

Cut/Truancy

Cutting, whether single period or full-day, is considered an unexcused absence. Habitual cutting or truancy is grounds for Saturday School, suspension, or a transfer from the current school. Cutting class is unacceptable! Students with more than 4 cuts in one semester per class *may* be dropped from the class. NO MAKE UP WORK IS PERMITTED FOR STUDENTS WHEN THEY CUT CLASS.

Cut - If a student is more than 30 minutes late to a class without appropriate permission from the office.

Truancy – If a student misses 3 or more periods in a school day or is tardy over 30 minutes without appropriate permission or prior clearance from the Attendance Office.

Policy Reminders

Just a brief reminder on some of our attendance policies:

- 18 year old students that excuse themselves are given a "U" in Aeries. It is the teacher's discretion to allow make-up assignments.
- Students have the opportunity to prearrange an absence (college visits, family trips, etc.), at the teacher's discretion. If a student does not complete the prearranged absence paperwork, these absences are marked "U" in Aeries, and it is the teacher's discretion to accept make-up assignments.
- Students on field trips should bring in the permission forms to the teacher at least 3 days in advance. Students are responsible for bringing the work or making up tests immediately upon return. (Students do not get the one day per day of absence to make up work.)

SARB (School Attendance Review Board)

For habitual tardies, cuts, unexcused absences, and excessive excused absences, a student may be referred to the School Attendance Review Board (SARB). Saturday School can make up absences to help keep under 10% absences.

The goal of the SARB board is to keep students in school, increase graduation rate, and develop and implement strategies to improve student attendance, behavior and achievement. At SARB meetings the parent(s)/guardian(s) and student are advised of the California State compulsory education laws and potential consequences for the student and parent(s)/guardian(s) if they are not complying with the law. Obstacles preventing school attendance are addressed, the SARB board suggests solutions, and a SARB contract is signed. Although the goal of a SARB meeting is to keep students in school and provide them (Version 3 8/12/20)

with a meaningful educational experience, SARB boards do have the power, when necessary, to refer students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) to the District Attorney's Office.

Off Campus Without Permission

PVPHS is a closed campus. Students may not leave campus at any time without permission and must sign out through the Attendance Office. Seniors may leave campus at lunch only if they have their student ID with an appropriate off campus pass. They must show their ID card to the campus supervisor at the gate. Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors may not leave campus at lunch unless prior approval has been completed. Check the Attendance Office for further details.
