# 2019-2020 Registration Packet Instructions (PLEASE READ)

#### 1. <u>DOWNLOADING:</u>

IMPORTANT: YOU SHOULD DOWNLOAD the packet and OPEN and WORK from the DOWNLOADED version. Save it to your desktop. This will save time and allow you to reference the file later. You must have high speed Internet access. The Palos Verdes Library District has free computer access available for users who do not have one at home.

#### 2. PRINTING:

Use the PRINT icon on the document. (It will look like a small typewriter.) YOU CAN PRINT AN INDIVIDUAL PAGE by selecting RANGE (i.e. 2 of 2 to print page 2) or CURRENT PAGE, or you can use the Print icon located at the top of the PDF document. Do NOT go to FILE and use the Print Option on your Browser because each page would then have to re-spool, and it will take too long to print.

- 3. PRINT THE TABLE OF CONTENTS FIRST (Page **3-4**). For your convenience, each page in the Registration Packet is numbered. It would be helpful to have the Table of Contents to look at while you are selecting the flyer/forms you need.
- 4. The fields that require you to enter information (i.e., Name, Address, Telephone) are interactive which means you can type directly on the form and then print it out. If you use the data entry forms on pages 9-10, duplicate data throughout the packet will only need to be entered once. Please note: Be sure to fill in the other areas that are NOT automatically filled in.
  - \* Click the mouse on the field and begin typing use the TAB key to move from one field to the next

    \* PRINT the form you have typed on before moving on to the next form or print forms before closing the
    registration packet. Data information that was typed can be saved if you have version XI or above of
    Adobe Reader. It allows you to save the packet after entries have been made. Earlier versions of Adobe
    Reader do not allow saving of data.

In order to type on the forms, you must have at the least version 7 of Adobe Reader. Download the program at: http://www.Adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html

5. <u>Apple users:</u> Note that the pdf may open with "Preview" another type of viewing software. To take full advantage of the "active" pdf, it is strongly recommended that you save the file, launch Adobe Reader, and open the Registration Packet.



#### Locker Rules/Guidelines

### Palos Verdes Peninsula High School National Honor Society



National Honor Society (NHS) is the nation's <u>premier</u> organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. More than just an honor roll, NHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character. These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since their beginnings in 1921.

Today, it is estimated that more than one million students participate in activities of the NHS. NHS chapters are found in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, many U.S. Territories, and Canada. Chapter membership not only recognizes students for their accomplishments, but challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service.

The PVPHS chapter of NHS will have candidate information packets available at the mandatory Honor Society Information meeting Wednesday, September 4th. Candidate information packets (CIP's) are a means to record your service hours and leadership. PLEASE check the eligibility list (posted outside of S10) to see if you (student) meet the requirements (such as minimum 3.65 unweighted GPA with no U's in citizenship). Students may submit CIP's. for selection in either their junior or senior year; however, the suggested period is junior year. The process by which students are selected is based upon the four pillars of NHS: Scholarship, Leadership, Service and Character.

#### CALIFORNIA SCHOLARSHIP FEDERATION (CSF)



#### **PVPHS Chapter of CSF**

California Scholarship Federation (CSF) is an organization that emphasizes high standards of scholarship and community service for California high school students. It was founded in 1921 and it is the oldest scholarship institution in the state of California. Mrs. Betsy Okamoto (H65) is the adviser for this great organization. Should you have any questions or concerns regarding membership or anything in general, please contact her at okamotob@pvpusd.net Please read the following information about the organization and find out why you should join as well as finding out important dates for the new school year.

#### What is CSF?

California Scholarship Federation (CSF) honors outstanding high school students for their academic excellence and community service and is recognized by colleges and universities throughout the country. Students may join CSF by simply applying for membership after each semester's grading period of high school (eight semesters total). Students may apply for membership should they meet the eligibility requirements. Students may check the eligibility lists that are posted outside of H65 and the Hawthorne Office to see if they meet the requirements. Please note that students are <u>not automatically</u> inducted into CSF; they must apply for membership <u>each semester</u>. If a student is a member in CSF for at least four (4) semesters by graduation (only sophomore through junior years with at least one semester from their senior year), they are granted the title of CSF Gold Sealbearer. They are presented gold cords to be worn at graduation, gold seal on their diploma and a note on their official transcript that indicates they have achieved Gold Sealbearer distinction. They are also eligible for one of the many scholarships that CSF awards every year.

Freshmen may join CSF after they have completed one semester of high school. They are considered junior or associate members under the constitution of the state CSF Board. Therefore, their first year in high school does not contribute to Gold Sealbearer status; once again, only their sophomore, junior and senior years count. However, students are encouraged to join and be recognized for their academic achievement. CSF membership is published each semester in the principal's update and on the CSF web site.

During the spring semester of their junior year, members in good standing are eligible to run for a position on the CSF Board which they will hold as a senior. The positions of president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, and four at large representatives are open. Board members assist with the membership drives, the Gold Sealbearer Banquet, as well as the yearly elections. This provides an opportunity for leadership experience and school involvement.

#### The Application Process

The application process is rather simple as it consists of three lists that weigh academic required classes, academic electives, as well as other qualifying classes and activities (such as AVID and Orchestra). Ten points must be earned (on each semester's application) to be eligible; applicants are disqualified if they earn a D, F or U in any class that semester. The points are based on the grades a student receives; three (3) points for each A, one (1) point for each B. If a student takes an honors or Advanced Placement (AP) class,

they will earn a bonus point for the grade (i.e. A in AP Chemistry would be four (4) points, three (3) points plus the bonus point); however, you may only use two honors or Advanced Placements classes for the bonus point(s). The cost for membership in this non-mandatory organization is \$25 each semester. Participation in school and community activities is encouraged, but is not required for general membership; however, if a student earns Sealbearer status (membership in four semesters starting with their sophomore grades with one during their senior year), they may apply for the community service stole which is worn at graduation. The stole signifies that a student has not only achieved high marks in high school and has also devoted much of their free time to assisting their community. They simply have to show proof of a minimum of 50 hours community service.

One important thing to note, applications must be submitted by the designated deadline, retroactive membership is NOT allowed except for grade changes by faculty. Another thing to note about the application process is that the deadline is very specific and set in stone. If the deadline is 12:45 p.m. by September 23<sup>rd</sup>, the application will not be accepted if it is turned in at 12:46 p.m. on September 23<sup>rd</sup>. The applications must be turned in by the applicant; no one else may turn it in for them regardless of the situation. The application period is roughly two (2) weeks long; plenty of time for students to handle their business.

Transfer Students: If a student transfers from another school in California and was a CSF member, they must notify adviser as the membership is transferable. If a student transferred from another school in California and was not a CSF member, they may not go back and apply for membership for semesters past; however, they may start the process at Peninsula if there are still four semesters in which they will attend the school. Transfer students, PLEASE notify adviser immediately and she will help with the process. Out of state transfer students, please see adviser as the process is a little bit different for you.

#### 2019-2020 Dates to Remember

Fall Membership Collections (based on grades received in June 2019):

This collection period is NOT for incoming freshmen as they do not have any grades in high school as of yet.

September 3<sup>rd</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>

Spring Membership Collections (based on grades received in February 2020): February 3<sup>rd</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> (tentative dates)

Please note that summer school grades may NOT be used under any circumstance. Check with the adviser, Mrs. Okamoto, before submitting the application if you have questions. For students' convenience, there will be an eligibility list posted outside of the Hawthorne Office as well as H65 which contains the names of all students eligible for CSF. Community college credits taken concurrently *with* the high school courses may be used on the application. The completed applications will only be accepted in room H66 during lunch ONLY! All instructions and requirements for eligibility are on the application. Students may pick up applications from the Hawthorne Office, or H65 the week prior to collection periods. Announcements will be made in the Daily Bulletin and on PVPHS.COM. It is the student's responsibility to adhere to these deadlines. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED! NOT HEARING OR READING THE BULLETIN ARE NOT AN ACCEPTABLE EXCUSES. Once you pick up your application, tell your friends. Don't wait until the last minute!

The Honor Code encourages students to act with maximum respect for themselves and others. A Panther demonstrating honorable behavior, among other things, will:


- Strive to perform to the best of his/her ability

- Follow proper channels if he/she has a concern
- Be graceful in defeat whether it be losing an athletic contest, receiving a disappointing grade, or not being selected for a coveted position
- Accept responsibility for his/her actions and their respective consequences as valuable life lessons

Panther Pride will inspire students to be honor-bound and to refrain from questionable behavior of any kind including, but not limited to, the following:

- Bullying or harassment (including cyber bullying)
- Cheating, forgery or plagiarism
- Tardiness or truancy
- Period absences on days when tests are being given or projects are due (unless prearranged with teacher)
- Vacations scheduled on school days

- 1. Parents should report student absences by dialing (310) 377-3635; this service is available 24 hours a day. Parents may also call the Attendance Office (310) 377-4888, extensions 681 or 682) between 6:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. If the Attendance Office is not contacted by telephone, the student must provide a written note from the parent/guardian upon the day he/she returns to school. Notes may be deposited anytime during the school day in the basket in the attendance office. Emails from parents are acceptable. NO late slips will be administered. Students who have been absent PART OF ONE DAY must report to the Attendance Office immediately upon returning to the campus.
- Students must get an OFF CAMPUS Pass BEFORE leaving campus. Students who fail to check out through the attendance office prior to leaving campus for any reason will receive a CUT. This includes 18 year olds.
- 3. Parents will be notified by an automatic phone service when students are out three or more periods in one day.
  - **VERY IMPORTANT:** State law has changed. Schools do not receive funding for excused absences. Schools do receive funding for prearranged absences of five (5) days or more if students come to the attendance office and pick up an independent study form.
- 4. Readmits for excused absences (allowing make-up work) will be issued for the following reasons: illness, medical or dental appointments.
- 5. Unexcused absences: non-prearranged college visits; family trips; baby-sitting; working; transportation problems; oversleeping; etc.
- 6. Truancy, suspension, or class cuts are unauthorized absences from school for any part of the day missed.
- 7. Parents planning to be out of town must notify the Attendance Office and provide temporary guardian information. THIS MUST BE DONE BEFORE THE PARENTS' DEPARTURE.
- 8. Students who have had a communicable disease must check with the school nurse before being readmitted to class.

#### Palos Verdes Peninsula High School Attendance & Off Campus Policies 2019-2020

#### **Absences**

The absence of a student from school, whether excused or unexcused, has a twofold effect upon the educational process. The absence not only removes the student from the classroom setting, but also impacts the District's ability to provide quality instruction. It is recognized that most absences are unavoidable and that most students make-up the work they missed.

Per current legislation, schools are funded for students in attendance each day (ADA). Although, the PVPUSD has one of the highest attendance rates in California, the financial impact of student absences continues to strain the District's financial resources. The School District receives a payment of \$50 from the state each day that a student is in school. Families are encouraged to plan medical appointments, activities and trips during the holidays or vacations to ensure the best possible learning experience.

Schools receive funding only for days in which a student is in attendance for at least one class period. If students must make appointments during the school day, it is important that they still attend school either before or after the appointment so that ADA monies will not be lost. However, if it is absolutely necessary for students to miss school, parents may assist in the recovery of funds by having the student complete the Independent Study Contract (if the student will be absent from school for 5 or more days) or by making a donation of \$50 for each day that the student is absent.

Working together allows schools to provide the strongest possible educational opportunities for our students.

#### **Tardies**

It is very important for students to arrive to class before the bell rings. For habitual tardiness, the student will be referred to the Student Attendance Review Board (SARB). Habitual tardiness becomes an attendance problem subject to disciplinary action. A student will be marked tardy if he/she arrives to class up to 30 minutes after the bell rings without appropriate permission from the office. If a student arrives to class over 30 minutes late, they will be marked as "excessively tardy." 3 excessive tardies = truant.

Arriving late up to ten minutes after the bell rings without appropriate permission from office or teacher. Tardy offenses are recorded per course.

#### **Cut/Truancy**

Cutting, whether single period or full-day, is considered an unexcused absence. Habitual cutting or truancy is grounds for Saturday School, suspension, or a transfer from the current school. Cutting class is unacceptable! Students with more than 4 cuts in one semester per class *may* be dropped from the class. NO MAKE UP WORK IS PERMITTED FOR STUDENTS WHEN THEY CUT CLASS.

**Cut** - If a student is more than 30 minutes late to a class without appropriate permission from the office.

**Truancy** – If a student misses 3 or more periods in a school day or is tardy over 30 minutes without appropriate permission or prior clearance from the Attendance Office.

Truancy offenses are recorded per year.

#### **Policy Reminders**

Just a brief reminder on some of our attendance policies:

- Students have the opportunity to prearrange an absence (college visits, family trips, etc.), at the
  teacher's discretion. If a student does not complete the prearranged absence paperwork, these
  absences are marked "U" in Aeries, and it is the teacher's discretion to accept make-up
  assignments.
- Students on field trips should bring in the permission forms to the teacher at least 3 days in advance. Students are responsible for bringing the work or making up tests immediately upon return. Board Policy/Administrative Regulation 6154: Arrangements for makeup work by students being released from class to participate infield trips or other school sponsored activities must be made in advance with the teacher.

#### **SARB (School Attendance Review Board)**

For habitual tardies, cuts, unexcused absences, and excessive excused absences, a student may be referred to the School Attendance Review Board (SARB).

The goal of the SARB board is to keep students in school, increase graduation rate, and develop and implement strategies to improve student attendance, behavior and achievement. At SARB meetings the parent(s)/guardian(s) and student are advised of the California State compulsory education laws and potential consequences for the student and parent(s)/guardian(s) if they are not complying with the law. Obstacles preventing school attendance are addressed, the SARB board suggests solutions, and a SARB contract is signed. Although the goal of a SARB meeting is to keep students in school and provide them with a meaningful educational experience, SARB boards do have the power, when necessary, to refer students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) to the District Attorney's Office.

#### Off Campus Without Permission

PVPHS is a closed campus. Students may not leave campus at any time without permission and must sign out through the Attendance Office. Seniors may leave campus at lunch only if they have their student ID with an appropriate off campus pass. They must show their ID card to the campus supervisor at the gate. Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors may not leave campus at lunch unless prior approval has been completed. Check the Attendance Office for further details.

#### DRESS CODE - PENINSULA HIGH SCHOOL

#### LOCKERS

#### Check page 7 to find out the times and guidelines for selecting your locker.

Lockers are provided as a convenience to students, and do not imply that the school assumes responsibility for the safety of the locker contents. Students who use lockers do so with the understanding that they accept all responsibility for both personal items and school property (including textbooks), which are stored in their lockers.

PVPHS can NOT guarantee the security of any lockers and is NOT responsible for stolen, damaged, or vandalized personal property, school property (including textbooks), or locks. Any school property missing from a locker will be paid for by the student and/or family.

Lockers are school property and may be searched by school personnel at any time. All lockers must be registered, and a locker card must be on file in the Hawthorne Office. If you change lockers, you MUST notify the Hawthorne Office immediately. Possible consequence – Your lock could be clipped, and all contents of your locker removed, so please register it.

Lockers should not be considered as "safe places" to keep valuable possessions (including electronic devices, money, etc.). Do not leave anything of value in the lockers overnight or over the weekend.

Students should not share their locker keys or combination with other students for any reason. In doing so, a student risks losing personal or school property and becomes culpable should dangerous or illegal items be placed in his or her locker by an unknown person.

Lockers should not be shared. There are enough lockers on the campus for every student to have their own locker.

Students are responsible for maintaining their locker in a clean and orderly fashion and will be held responsible for damage or defacing of their locker.

All lockers must be cleared out by the last day of school in June. Any items left in the lockers will be donated to charity.

By following the guidelines herein, you will be taking the steps to ensure the safety of your personal belongings as well as school property.

#### **OFF CAMPUS POLICY**



This is a *CLOSED* campus. Students may not leave campus at any time without permission and must sign out through the Attendance Office.

Students who are in SCROC must carry their SCROC ID. They may leave campus at the end of 4th period after they show their SCROC ID to security at the gate.

Seniors (12th Grade) may leave at lunch or at the end of their school day if they have their student ID with the appropriate senior off campus pass. They must show the ID to security at the gate. Seniors who do not have a 5th or 6th period must get a senior off campus pass.

Juniors (11th Grade), Sophmores (10th Grade), and Freshmen (9th Grade) MAY NOT LEAVE CAMPUS AT LUNCH.

- If you do not have a 5th or 6th period, you must obtain an off campus stamp from the Attendance Office and leave at the end of your school day (FALL SPEC OR SPRING SPEC STAMP ON THE STUDENT ID).
- NOTE: If you have a 6th period, but no 5th period, you must stay on campus. You should stay in the covered lunch area, not in the PE or amphitheater area.

Students who have special circumstances, involved in athletics, OR WHO DO NOT HAVE ANY CLASSES AFTER 3RD, must clear with the Attendance Office and receive an off-campus stamp on their ID.

#### PARKING RULES - PENINSULA HIGH SCHOOL

- All parking on campus is reserved. You must have a parking pass. Do not park in any numbered space or other areas of the campus without approval of the school administration or campus security. Any vehicle parked without authorization is subject to citation and towing. All visitors should check in with the Main Office and park in spaces designated for visitors.
- All <u>STAFF</u> parking spaces are reserved from 6:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. No students or parents are allowed to park in staff parking spaces during these hours. You will be cited.
- Students without a permit may park in the main <u>student parking</u> without a permit <u>after 1:45 p.m.</u> This is to accommodate student athletes and seniors who return to campus for Period 6 athletics and class. Vehicles parked on campus prior to 1:45 p.m. <u>not displaying an appropriate pass will be issued a citation</u>. Spaces along the wall in front of the gym are reserved from 6:30 a.m. until 2:45 p.m. (school hours) all days of the week; and especially <u>DO NOT PARK AT ANY TIME in the handicapped, bus zones, visitor spaces, or any place that is NOT a designated parking spot. Parking in non-parking spots may result in a citation and tow at the owner's expense.</u>
- Students who park in the handicapped spaces must have a valid handicapped placard and registration from the CA DMV displayed clearly in their vehicle with the current <u>DATE showing</u>. The Lomita Sheriffs Department will cite students who have been issued a placard but do not have it posted. Students also need to show proof of handicapped registration and placard to the nurse and administration.

ON CAMPUS STUDENT PARKING IS FOR SENIORS WITH A PERMIT WHO WERE SELECTED FROM THE CURRENT QUARTER'S SIGNUPS (DRAWN AT RANDOM) OR FOR STUDENTS WHO HAVE MADE PREVIOUS ARRANGEMENTS (BLACK & GOLD AFFAIRE AUCTION; MAIN EVENT AUCTION, ETC. NO ADDITIONAL RESERVED PARKING AVAILABLE.)

Each quarter a selection will be held for seniors from a pre-determined sign-up list to receive a parking permit for one (1) quarter (approximately 10 weeks) to park on campus. There are <u>four (4) quarters</u> in a school year. <u>Each senior is guaranteed at least one (1) quarter provided the student signs up.</u> A student that was selected for a certain quarter can defer their parking privilege to another quarter if they so desire.


Below is a list of rules students must sign and agree to follow when they are awarded a parking permit through the lottery system. Seniors selected through a current selection list are allowed to park on campus as well as those who have made previous arrangements. All other students should park on Silver Spur and Hawthorne. Parking is not allowed down Basswood, across the street, behind the Arco gas station, Chase Bank, Bank of America, nor in the Shopping Center area. Students who wish to drive should arrive early to park closer to the school.

- New permits will be enforced on the FIRST day of each Quarter/Semester.
- All cars must be locked and windows closed all the way.
- > Selling of parking permits is not allowed under any circumstances.
- Any vehicle <u>without a permit displayed</u> will receive a citation from <u>School Security</u> or <u>Lomita Sheriffs</u>. This includes permits that are not clearly visible. If your permit is not visibly displayed, **DO NOT PARK IN THE LOT**.
- If a student loses a permit, they will be charged a \$10 replacement fee.
- Each student is assigned a space. The space number will match the permit number. If your spot is occupied, please attempt to park as close to your spot as possible, make sure your parking permit is visible, and report the problem to a campus supervisor or a secretary in the Hawthorne Office immediately.
- > Students will not be issued a permit without their license plate number on their application. This becomes critically important when there is a problem with your spot, and you are ticketed.
- The donation for the regular parking permit is <u>\$40</u>. This donation covers the maintenance costs of supervising the lot. It is very much appreciated. Students should bring their signed paper with them when they pick up their parking permits or a permit will not be issued.



If your ID is lost or stolen, go to the Hawthorne Office for a replacement (Replacement fee - \$10). IMPORTANT: You must have your physical ID card in order to purchase bids and enter into dances, winter formal, prom, etc., and entry into games. (No database printouts OR A PICTURE OF YOUR ID ON YOUR PHONE will be accepted.) If your ID is lost or stolen, you will be required to purchase another one in order to participate in these activities, so please PROTECT YOUR ID!
